## Merry Christmas and Happy 2023 to all!

This coming March will mark one full year of my tenure as Music Director at Siesta Key Chapel and I could not be more gleeful. The Christmas services were everything that I had hoped and more. We bore witness to the birth of Christ with services that musically ran the gamut. We experienced British Carols, French Carols, Creole Jazz, African rhythms and texts, contemporary hymns and songs, and more! The hallmark of our music program is its diversity. We create music in all styles and that is an exceptional trait. Hopefully everyone enjoyed it!

As we ring in the 2023 calendar year we are already over a month into the liturgical year which began with the First Sunday of Advent on November 27, 2022. During Advent, you may have noticed Pastor Ruth wearing purple stoles. A majority of the candles on the Advent wreath are also purple. This historically regal color signifies times of penitential preparation. As such, it is used both for Advent as well as Lent. Hope, Peace, Joy and Love are the themes of each Sunday's respective candle. The rose color on the third Sunday highlights the anticipatory joy of the coming of Christ at Christmas, even in the period of waiting.

Immediately following Advent, of course, is Christmas! White, a symbol of holiness and purity, is used here and on days that mark pivotal events in the life of Christ, such as Epiphany and the Baptism of the Lord, as well as Easter, Trinity, and Christ the King Sundays. Sundays marked with white have great significance to our understanding of Jesus as God.

After the celebration of the Baptism of the Lord, we enter into the first section of the largest period of the liturgical year, Ordinary Time, which is signified by the color green. What comes to mind when we think of the color green? Grass, perhaps? Plants? Hedges? Palm trees? All of the above give images of life. During this time the readings often remind us of the life we have been given to fulfill the mission of Christ's church here on earth.

Lent begins with Ash Wednesday, to take place on February 22nd this year, and is also marked with the regally penitential color of purple. The Lenten season culminates in Palm Sunday where Jesus triumphantly enters Jerusalem on a donkey to large crowds. All four of the Gospels (Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John) have accounts of this event. We use purple for Holy Week!

Maundy Thursday is predicated upon everything to do with Chapter 13... not the bankruptcy proceeding but rather the Gospel of John. The term 'Maundy' is derived from the Latin word 'Mandatum' which means commandment. In Spanish the word is "Mandamiento". Depending on the translation, the scripture reads as such: "If I then, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet. For I have given you an example, that you should do as I have done to you." On this date we commemorate the Last Supper and Jesus' example. The church is then stripped bare in preparation for Good Friday.

Easter Sunday, and the succeeding 49 days, are marked with white and gold. Pentecost is the only date on the liturgical calendar for which the color red is prescribed. Red, a representation of fire, is oft associated with the "tongues of fire" spoken of in the Acts of the Apostles where the Holy Spirit comes to the early church. The Monday after Pentecost we return to the aforementioned season of Ordinary Time. The liturgical year culminates in the late November celebration of Christ the King which, similar to Easter, has a white and gold theme.

Speaking of Pentecost, I am extremely excited to announce that we will once again host a Jazz Service this year with the full complement of Jazz musicians to truly celebrate those "tongues of fire". Pentecost falls on Sunday May 28th, 2023 so mark your calendars now! We will also be announcing the Spring concert series to be held at the "same Bat time, same Bat channel"-twice a month on Sundays at 3PM. Schedule to be announced in the coming weeks.

Interested in joining our **Chapel Choir**? There are two opportunities for you and anyone that you may know! Our regular Wednesday rehearsals will resume on January 25th at 6:30PM in the music room. If this schedule doesn't quite fit with yours there is no reason to fret! Join us at 9:00AM on Sundays to practice for worship. We are happy to have you!

As always, a moment of levity- What is Good King Wenceslas' favorite type of pizza?...Deep pan, crisp, and even.


