### From the Pastor's Desk

And like alligators, our congregation is, at times, quietly meditative, as on Ash Wednesday, yet also ready to spring into action, as on SouperBowl Sunday, and with our giving MATCH challenge. We, too, enjoy being by the water, as evidenced at our delightfully expanding Chapel on the Beach services.

On Ash Wednesday we held our noontime service in the Chapel, followed by a **pop-up sunset service at** 

**the beach.** The scene was something like a movie (*O Brother, Where Art Thou?*) with people hearing music, seeing people gathering by the cross, and streaming out of the water, from under colorful umbrellas, and all along the shoreline, until there was hardly any sand to be seen in a large circle around the pier. Approximately 90 people felt the Spirit's nudge, with around 50 coming forward for the imposition of ashes at the end of the service, which lead right into Mike Cosentino's flag ceremony and a stunning sunset. Along with Ash Wednesday, we are seeing 100-145 attendees on our weekly **Sundays at 9am Chapel at the Beach**. God's Word is being proclaimed with joy!

Many thanks to **Youth Olivia Bell**, who spearheaded our **SouperBowl Sunday** canned soup drive for the local food pantry. Through your generosity, we received 110 cans of soup and \$90, to share with those whose bowls are not so full this season.

**Please enjoy** the abundance of church activities this month, including a wonderful Concert Series, interactive Bible Studies, Men's Fellowship, Knit & Sew, All-Church Brunches, and plenty of volunteer opportunities (Easter Egg Hunt helpers; Scripture reading; Ushering; Office Volunteer corps...) Greetings!

Lent is upon us and Easter is unbelievably imminent. Musically, Lent is often marked with hymns in minor keys. Think "Forty Days and Forty Nights" or "Let All Mortal Flesh Keep Silence". On Ash Wednesday we are reminded that we "are dust, and to dust [we] shall return." (Genesis 3:19) reminding us of the fall of Adam and Eve from a state of innocence in the Garden of Eden. During this season many are called to fast or reflect upon past personal sins. Maybe you celebrate "Fat Tuesday" and then give up sweets, carbs, or your

nightly glass of wine until Easter Sunday. In our readings we hear about Jesus' temptation in the desert and the journey to the cross. All of this may seem to be a complete one eighty degree turn from the joy we experienced just weeks ago at Christmas; however, the Christmas and Lenten season are more intertwined than we might believe.

This past December, a great friend of mine by the name of John T. Kyler, a Catholic musician and theologian, wrote an article entitled "Should Christmas Music be Less Joyful?" In this article we are reminded of the four canticles in Luke's Gospel regularly associated with Christmas that we should keep in mind during this season of Lent.

- The Magnificat: "My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my savior, for he has looked with favor on his lowly servant." (Luke 1:46-48)
- 2. Zacheriah's Benedictus: "Blessed be the Lord God of Israel, for he has looked favorably on his people and redeemed them". (Luke 1:68-69)
- 3. The Angels' Gloria: "Glory to God in the highest heaven and on earth peace among those who He favors" (Luke 2:14)
- 4. Simeon's Nunc Dimittis: "...for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you have prepared in the presence of all peoples."

Through these canticles we are reminded of the peaceful and redemptive love of our God as well as our own salvation. Let us not look upon this season as one of darkness but one of great light in which we remember the importance of the daily resurrection we are granted through each sunrise. One in which we can triumph over sexism, racism, homophobia, xenophobia, and all hatred. Each sunrise provides us with a new birth. On Saturday February 18th we hosted a group of young organists from Dr. Laura Ellis' organ studio at the University of Florida in Gainesville. Five undergraduates took part in an organ crawl of Sarasota churches. We began with our beautiful Schantz organ at SKC before driving over to St. Boniface to try out their gorgeous Möller pipe organ. After a lovely lunch downtown they traveled to Church of the Redeemer before heading back home Saturday afternoon. We hope to have these young organists back again in the fall or next spring on our Concert Series.

Speaking of the Concert Series- we started off the Spring on a thrilling Latin note with a string quartet playing chamber music composed by Latin American composers from Mexico, Brazil, Columbia and more. Many noticed that the melodies from these compositions have been turned into popular songs over the years. We had over fifty people in attendance and look forward to having YOU join us on March 19th for a Jazz concert featuring Michele Pruyn and Kevin Celibi's Harmonic Sanity Jazz Band playing Gypsy Jazz. This is a bit different from our Benny Goodman and Glenn Miller archetype of what Jazz is; however, you are sure to enjoy it! Please come and bring your friends!

Beginning March 1st we will begin **9:30AM choir rehearsals in the music room** for those that are interested in singing for either the 9AM Beach Service or our 11AM worship service in the Chapel. Please stop by and try it out! No musical experience required!
