Chapel on the Beach welcomed 150 worshippers on Palm Sunday and over 200 on Easter Sunday. The Easter morning early arrivals enjoyed a **rainbow** at Patriot's Pier, followed by a **waterspout** and distant thunder and lightning that sent us hightailing up to the Chapel for the beach service. The sanctuary was packed with joyous worshippers in bathing suits and Easter outfits; a sight to behold. The common theme afterward was variations on: "I've never been inside this church before; what a beautiful, nature-filled space to worship God!" "I feel like I've come home." "Surely God is present in this place."

The most recent Class of **New Members** at SKC did not ask, "What can the church do for me?" Instead, the most frequent question we heard was, "How do I sign up to volunteer at **Beth-El**?"

All-Church Brunches, Men's Fellowship and Knit & Sew continue to offer **opportunities for fellowship** that spill out into caring for others with gratitude and appreciation for the gifts we have been given by our gracious God, including the community of saints surrounding us at SKC.

On Easter Sunday, the people of SKC gratefully met the generous \$50,000 **MATCH CHALLENGE**, resulting in \$100,000 for a new church project of mission and ministry. From the pulpit, a **church-wide challenge** has been given: **memorize the 23**rd **Psalm** until we all can speak it with confidence and assurance, knowing that **Jesus is the Good Shepherd**, making us lie down in green pastures for rest and restoration; leading us beside still waters to partake of the Water of Life, and challenging us to lovingly do the same for our neighbors.

On Sunday, April 30, Dr. Paul Kirbas offered a class in our education hour that was entitled **"Dissecting the Bible: The Surprising Twist that Happens when we look Deeper into the Scriptures"**. Using the example of a TV show back in the 70's and 80's called Quincy ME, the class began by recalling that the show often started with a simple understanding of a possible death, until a deeper investigation of the Medical Examiner revealed an interesting twist, that changed everyone's thinking. Likewise, the Bible is filled with scriptures that often lead us to simple understandings, but a deeper dissection of those passages leads to a

very different idea of what the passages might be saying, or in some cases, what they might not be saying. Using four different passages, Dr. Kirbas led us through a dissecting examination that revealed surprising insights that can cause a whole different idea of what the passage is all about. From the cliff hanging ending of the Gospel of Mark, to a real punch found in the poetic words of I Corinthians 13, from what seems like a multiple personality in the book of James, to a conspiracy surrounding Paul's supposed words about women keeping silent in the church, in Quincy ME style, the class dissected these passages to reveal surprising revelations.

Graduate Theological Foundation

Siesta Key Chapel served as the host location for the taping of the graduation exercises of the Graduate Theological Foundation. The Foundation is an Indiana Chartered Institution that offers graduate degrees for ministry professionals, often coming from underserved communities around the world. Dr. Paul J Kirbas serves as the President of GTF. The mission statement of the Graduate Theological Foundation is "Bringing light into the world, through interfaith, international, multicultural education since 1962".





In keeping with this mission statement, the graduation exercise was an interfaith experience. Dr. Tony Stultz, the GTF professor of Buddhist Studies, offered a reading from the Buddhist text The Dhammapada. Dr. Ruth Smalt read a passage from the Christian New Testament. Rabbi Ann Feibelman, who serves as a hospice chaplain in Sarasota, read a passage in both Hebrew and English from the Hebrew Scriptures. Dr. Mohamed Benkhaled, the Imam of the Islamic Society of Sarasota and recent

graduate of the Graduate Theological Foundation, read a passage from the Koran, first singing it in Arabic, and then reading it in English.

Graduate Theological Foundation, continued

GTF professor and Vice President at Notre Dame University Dr. Hugh Page offered the graduation address. His address, entitled "Toward Transformational Models for Ministry in a Fragmented World", lifted up three strategies for the role of ministry in the current world situation, and celebrated the way in which the Graduate Theological Foundation is uniquely positioned to address those strategies.
