UKULELE GROUP - Sarasota Strummers, Eleiza Faria

Sarasota Strummers welcomes everyone to **join in the fun playing the ukulele.** The group's first meetup was on the beach which was uncomfortable and sandy. Next they moved to a park where they were attacked by ants. Needless to say they are very grateful to be meeting now at Siesta Key Chapel on **Wednesday evenings from 7-8pm in Fellowship Hall.** The evening meeting time allows those who work a chance to participate in the group.

The group "jams" are a joyous event making music together. There is no other way to describe it. Members range in age from the 20's to retirees and skill levels from beginner to professional. One man has played guitar for 50 years and now also plays the ukulele, while other members just recently started this year. Everyone is working to improve their skills playing. Starting only a few months ago, the group continues to grow. They believe the more the merrier.

The **ukulele is of Portuguese origin** but was popularized in Hawaii. In the Hawaiian language the word ukulele roughly translates as "jumping flea", perhaps because of the movement of the player's fingers.

Eleiza, the group organizer, got started playing the ukulele when she picked up a friend's ukulele and loved it. Previously trying the guitar, she realized her hands were too small and weak to play. The Ukulele was the perfect size and sounded beautiful! As an Autistic person, Eleiza organized the group to challenge herself socially and **share her love of playing the ukulele**.

Starting the group on a whim, she listed it on FaceBook and Meetup. The response was so much more than expected. She remembers thinking "Oh boy! I run a ukulele group now! I love it and **see it as a community service**".

After finding a 1600 page ukulele song book online, Eleiza began selecting music for the group. The selections are a **mix of old and new songs** that include both easy and more challenging pieces. The members get new music each week to practice before gathering to play.
