A Culture of Generosity

"Tell them about the dream, Martin!" As Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. began his well-crafted, scholarly speech that fateful day in 1963, the Gospel singer Mahalia Jackson cried out from the choir, "Tell them about the dream, Martin!" And in that moment, Dr. King put aside his notes, took a deep breath, and spoke the now-famous words, "I have a dream." And in this dream, he turns our eyes to the immortal words of the prophet Isaiah, a dream still relevant for us today:

I have a dream that one day every valley shall be exalted, every hill and mountain shall be made low, the rough places will be made plain, and the crooked places will be made straight, and the glory of the Lord shall be revealed, and all flesh shall see it together.

Dr. King's dream calls for our active partnering with God in working for justice and mercy with compassion and intelligence. As Reformed Christians, we are saved to serve. **God's grace comes first; we respond with thankfulness and service.** We are creatures with a special job as stewards to care for all of creation, before we hand it over to those who will follow. The apostle Peter encourages us, "Like good stewards of God's grace, serve one another with the gifts you have been given" (1 Peter 4:10).

Presbyterian minister Todd Bolsinger, author of *Canoeing the Mountains* and *Tempered Resilience*, challenges us with a deeper understanding of Stewardship, moving from an annual pledge card drive alone, to a year-round **Culture of Generosity**. "Stewardship," he says, "is about taking care of what is most valuable and accomplishing together what all of us most want to get done." And just what is that? I would venture that the mission statement of Siesta Key Chapel, which you read every Sunday on the cover of our Order of Worship, continues to be our vibrant and worthy guide in living lives of joyful stewardship:

Surrounded by the beauty of creation,
we respond to God's grace in
worship, fellowship, and praise,
eager to grow in the knowledge of our Lord and Savior
as we follow the Spirit's call to love one another,
proclaim the Gospel and serve the world God loves.

In this Advent season, as we prepare our hearts for the birth of our Savior, we are invited to invest ourselves—time, talents and treasures—in good stewardship, sowed in abundance, reflecting our very identity as people of faith seeking to restore God's creation. And the glory of the Lord shall be revealed, and all flesh shall see it together.

Let There be Light!

Outside and Inside lighting highlight the B&G improvements this month.

FPL has finally replaced the south end (ODA)
 Electrical Pole with a new LED Light. The old Light was destroyed when a truck hit the light pole last year. So it is nice to have our Parking area well lighted on that side of the campus.



- VPI Inc has installed lighting to enhance the visual experience for both streaming video and local event attendees with Chapel stage and back lighting. This will greatly improve the overall ambiance and visual appeal of events. Navigating a learning curve and addressing the power requirements for the back lights makes this a continuing work in progress.
- Windemuller Electric installed a (2) Circuit runway under the Ramp
 to relocate underground wiring to an above ground solution that was
 causing circuit issues especially during the wet season. This new runway
 will vastly improve reliability for both the Pavilion light, the Cross light,
 and hopefully restore some of the parking lights.


