#### In Praise of Song

Summertime is the season to delight in slowing down to listen to good music; to enjoy long gentle evenings singing *Taps* at the shore; and of joining the birds in singing joyfully at the break of day. Summer is the season where we sing **hymns of awe and praise** for Jesus' ministry of teaching and healing love.

Peter Marty, Editor of Christian Century, credits **gifted church musicians** with encouraging us as a congregation to sing together, to lose ourselves in **wonder**, **love and praise**. Marty believes that a caring music director "yearns for

each and every soul to discover that singing is sacred duty. Led well, those who thought they couldn't sing, or who don't want to sing, suddenly find themselves enveloped in lovely ways by **the resonant voice of the church singing together**."

Here at Siesta Key Chapel, we are deeply fortunate to be led by Conner in a robust and thoughtful repertoire of weekly music. These past few years, **Conner has developed a ministry of music** that includes vocalists, instrumentalists, young voices, Chapel Choir, Handbell Choir, concerts, and, most importantly, a richness of **congregational singing**.

Growing up, I learned much of my **theology through hymns**. Church choir—from an early age through seminary—offered the opportunity to continually grow in my understanding of scripture, particularly the Psalms, which were meant to be sung. Here at the Chapel, it is a complete joy to plan worship with Conner as together we consider the scripture for the week, and build out a complete thematic service encompassing the Psalms, sermon, prayers, liturgy, and song.

Theologian Eugene Peterson names just how vital singing is to our soul, writing, "When we are normal, we talk. When we are dying, we whisper. **But when there is more in us than we can contain, we sing.**" This summer, I encourage you to **sing boldly**, with the record player or Spotify, with the songbirds at daybreak, and especially with one another in worship. Thanks be to God.

### Vacatiin Donations


After a stay, give it away

Siesta Key Chapel is currently working with Vacation Donations in partnership with Community Harvest SRQ to collect non-perishable surplus food for distribution to those in need in the Sarasota community. Visitors or



seasonal residents can donate food by dropping it off in a bin on the Pavilion deck before they return to their homes up North. The food will be collected and delivered to local agencies such as Second Chance Last Opportunity, Salvation Army, Harvest House, and others.

Community Harvest SRQ is a non-profit organization that is part of the Transition US movement. They are dedicated to creating community-led solutions for the local food system. In addition to collecting non-perishable surplus food, they also gather excess fruits and vegetables from local farms to distribute to food banks and the Newtown Farmer's Market.
