One morning stands out as a snapshot in time. Horseback riding in the rugged, highaltitude Rocky Mountain National Park, we came across **two bull elk** with enormous racks, signifying power and might. We kept our distance! Moments later, we were immersed in a quiet forest of aspen. Quaking, glimmering aspen. We learned that aspen are more than white bark trees with heart-shaped leaves. Aspen trees are part of a grand organism with a sprawling root system. Their network of interconnected roots can produce new trees for a thousand years. The roots abide patiently in a connectional community until the sun's warmth touches the soil (often after a fire or avalanche) and stimulates the system to spark a new cycle of growth and beauty.


Dear people, I rejoice in each one of you, and look forward to **worshipping** and working, playing and praying with you this fall at God's Treehouse.





It's been a busy Summer on the SKC property with the rain storms, the Siesta Key road paving project, and our own projects.

SKC survived the heavy amounts of rain water but neighbors on our surrounding property were flooded. We continue to work with our neighbors to get the County to address drainage problems on the North and East property line areas.



Both Gleason Ave and Reid St around SKC were recently repaved. SKC has allowed Ajax Paving to Stage their equipment on the SKC property for The SRQ County road Paving Project on Siesta Key. This project should come to an end around mid September.

Fellowship Hall now has a new vinyl plank floor and is getting some needed storage space added in the "stage" end of the room. New interior paint has been scheduled as well.

The Pavilion Ladies Restroom upgrade is complete.

1.79 tons of junk was also removed from the property this summer.
