# From the Pastor's Desk



Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

May you walk in grace and live in peace.

(Ephesians 1:3-14)

November is here, bringing with it pumpkins and a time change; friends returning from up north; and Thanksgiving, my favorite holiday. We are firmly on our way to recovering from the devastation of back-to-back hurricanes. Our congregation is once again worshipping

God in the Chapel; holding Bible Study; and breaking bread at All-Church Brunches and Men's Fellowship Lunches.

It's also election season, and the world holds its collective breath. How then shall we "walk in grace and live in peace?"

I turn to Will Willimon, professor at Duke Divinity School, who in turn considers Karl Barth's classic, *The Epistle to the Romans,* in his recent reflection entitled, "On Not Giving Politics the Last Word" (*Journalforpreachers.com.*)

Barth, writing in the days leading up to Nazism and WWII, and Willimon, a highly respected living theologian writing at the cusp of this November 5, 2024 election, share similar thoughts on what truly matters in these days of angst and foreboding: There is a river whose streams make glad the city of God,

In a world of lies and disinformation, God has given us not only the way and the life but also the truth—Jesus Christ, our judgment, our deliverance. By paying attention to the leading of the Holy Spirit, we can do the main business of the church, daring to listen to and to talk about the God who is, rather than prattle about culture's godlets. To live in truth and love, not to give sovereignty to human entities rather than to God, is to embrace our extraordinary opportunity to testify that the world and all that is in it is God's. That an itinerant mid-eastern Jew from Nazareth, who lived briefly, died violently, and rose unexpectedly, is even now busy reconciling the world to God.

Like Karl Barth and Will Willimon, I encourage you to ask, "What is our gracious God up to in this unique time and how can we be part of what God is doing?" Because what God may be up to is so much more interesting than our anxieties about the future.

# **BUILDINGS, GROUNDS & TECHNOLOGY - Barry Cline**

### **Hurricane Helene Summary**

Close to 2ft' of water in Lower Chapel, Lower Music Room and Lower Pavilion Elevator Buildings – this includes the Electrical Room and the Garden Closet

- 1. Rainbow Remediation Contracted
  - Cleared out all LL contents of Chapel, Music and Elevator areas
  - Cut Drywall at 4' Line through out
  - Cut out Cabinets and Shelving
  - Removed Carpet and Tile and Rugs
  - Electrical Outlets were submerged
- 2. (5) Lower-Level HVAC Units and (2) Dehumidifiers Flooded and no longer working
- 3. Elevator Pit Flooded with 4 ½ of Water
- 4. Irrigation Well Pump Flooded
- 5. No real tree damage just lots of debris, pine straw that was washed away, moved and deposited throughout the East side of the Campus.
- 6. Hazeltine began Cleanup and was 34 Done when Milton Struck

# **Hurricane Milton Summary**

- 1. Roughly 6" of Water again in same Lower Levels but drywall was already removed.
- 2. Rainbow International Remediation
  - Cleaned Floors, Studs and Mold Spraying over several Days
  - Installed Drying Fans that ran for several Days in all locations
  - Pumped water out of Elevator Pit
- 3. Tree Damage Lots and Lots of Branches and Debris
  - Large Cedar Leaning on Music Ramp and Building primarily damaging the ramp railings
  - Memorial Garden Pine fell on the NE Chapel Outside Stairwell damaging ramp railings
  - Several large pine trees around the campus had large branches snapped and hanging our buildings and walkways
  - North and East Campus are still full of Debris
- 4. Elevator Assessment is working
- 5. Fire Alarm Systems and Sprinkler Systems are all working again
